GENERAL POLICIES

Admissions

Applicants must complete and submit all the required application materials. (See checklist on Page 1.) Additionally,

- Students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or better.
- Students must be at least entering their sophomore year.
- Students must have upheld good academic and judicial standing with their home institutions, if applicable.
- Students must be at least 18 years of age.

Proof of English Proficiency In order to learn effectively, students are expected to be independent English users with proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Non-native English speakers are required to demonstrate that they have reached the high intermediate level in English language skills, with certification or other evidence equivalent to the following minimum overall TOEFL scores: Paper Based Test 550+, Computer Based Test 213+, or Internet Based Test 80+.

YEAR-LONG PROGRAM SPECIFICS

Students may enroll in a selected year-long Certificate Program for the complete academic year (fall and spring semesters). The first semester of each year-long program is offered in the fall only and the second semester is offered in the spring only. Students with prior knowledge of the selected field of study may be admitted to the non-beginning semester of a first-year Certificate, after submitting a portfolio of their work to be assessed and approved. The second semester of each year-long Certificate takes place in the spring semester only, prices and deadline are available on request.

Year-long Certificate Program students may choose to start with the Certificate and move into the Professional/Advanced Certificate, completing a two-year program.

Students applying for the Professional/Advanced Certificate Program must provide proof of a solid background in the selected area. An admissions committee will review the application and accept only those students who meet the entry requirements. Please note that if you select but do not meet the requirements for the Professional/Advanced Certificate Program, you will have the option of being admitted to the Certificate Program.

All Certificate Programs are offered in Florence only.

Please note that once you arrive at LdM you will not be allowed to switch Programs or Location.

Students must successfully complete the entire course sequence to receive a Certificate or Professional/Advanced Certificate. $\begin{tabular}{ll} \hline \end{tabular}$

YEAR-LONG CERTIFICATE REGISTRATION POLICIES

- 1 The LdM Certificate and Professional/ Advanced Certificate courses have already been determined by LdM. Students cannot change their courses or sections.
- Students may attend only the courses listed on their Official Registration form. Auditing is not allowed.
- 3. Students applying to a non-beginning level of the selected program will take a level test for each course of the chosen semester. Students who fail one or more level tests will have the option of enrolling in the beginning level of the Certificate or switching to the Study Abroad Program and paying the difference in tuition.
- 4. Students pre-registered for a non-beginning course, including Italian, must check the LdM Academic Catalog to make sure they meet all the prerequisites. A placement test will be administered to confirm the students' level. As a result of the placement test, LdM reserves the right to move students into a different level.
- In the event of insufficient enrollment in particular courses (especially at the higher levels), LdM reserves the right to adjust the balance of teaching/open studio hours.

- 6. Mid-term and final exams will be given only on the scheduled days that appear on each course syllabus. For no reason (i.e. religious holidays, travel plans, family matters, etc.) will they be moved. Exams are scheduled during normal class times, so more than one exam may be administered on the same day.
- 7. LdM does not offer Pass/Fail grades or Incompletes, only letter grades. All classes registered for and grades received will appear on each student's final transcript. Students are responsible for understanding the LdM grading system and their home institution's minimum grade requirement for the transfer of credit. Detailed information about grading/evaluation can be found in the specific course syllabi.
- 8. The Certificate program is comprised of a series of courses that have been determined by LdM, as a complete learning experience in the field. All of these courses must be completed as part of the program. Students will be granted the Certificate or Professional/Advanced Certificate upon successful completion of the course sequence. Students who do not successfully complete the course sequence will receive a transcript only.

- Students with learning disabilities will be subject to local educational standards. Based on current and official documentation of the disability, LdM offers assistance to these students. It is each student's responsibility to provide this documentation within the deadline.
- 10. LdM reserves the right to withhold the certificate/academic record and/or housing deposit of students who violate contract agreements related to housing and/ or academic issues (i.e. any balance or debt incurred) and/or whose behavior is considered detrimental towards the institute and other students.
- 11. Each student must carefully read the Lorenzo de' Medici Rules of Conduct. A copy of the Rules of Conduct must be signed by every student during Orientation.
- 12. Attendance is mandatory for all courses.
- 13. No refunds will be issued for classes dropped after arrival at LdM.
- 14. It is ABSOLUTELY REQUIRED that all students attend the ORIENTATION MEETING in Florence. Students must make sure they plan their travel itinerary accordingly.

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SEMESTER CERTIFICATE REGISTRATION POLICIES

- The Semester Certificate courses have already been determined by LdM and students cannot change the course selection.
- Mandatory courses or sections cannot be changed. Only one elective course can be changed upon arrival at LdM, choosing from the list of approved elective courses and depending on course availability. Section changes are not allowed for elective or mandatory courses. Any Elective change is only allowed during the first week of classes, before the Final Registration deadline.
- Students may attend only the courses listed on their Official Registration form. Auditing is not allowed.
- 4. Students will be required to take a level test for each course that includes a prerequisite. Students who fail one or more level tests will have the option of enrolling in the Study Abroad Program and paying the difference in tuition.
- In the event of insufficient enrollment in particular courses (especially at the higher levels), LdM reserves the right to adjust the

- balance of teaching/open studio hours.

ATTENDANCE REGULATIONS

- Course attendance is a primary requirement for a responsible learning experience at LdM.
- Punctuality is mandatory. Students must arrive in class on time: any lateness or leaving class early will impact the participation grade and the Final Grade.
- Students are responsible for keeping track of their absences and for catching up on any missed work.
- For no reason (i.e., religious holidays, travel plans, family matters, etc.)
 will absences be excused.
- Make-up classes are always mandatory as part of the course program.

- Students will receive an "F" on each exam they miss.
- Students who leave LdM before the end of the term must fill out an Official Withdrawal Request form and return it to their advisor. Students who submit the form by the "W" Withdrawal deadline will receive a "W" for each non-completed course. Students who submit the form by the "W/F" Withdrawal deadline will receive a "W/F" for each non-completed course. Students who leave LdM without submitting the form will receive an "F" in each non-completed course. In all cases, students will not be eligible for credits or receive a refund.
- Students who absent themselves from courses will have their final grade penalized as indicated on the following table:

STUDENT CONDUCT

Students are expected to conduct themselves in a responsible, law-abiding manner, consistent with the rules and regulations of LdM, as well as with applicable United States, Italian and European Union governmental laws generally. Deviations from such rules, regulations and laws include, but are not limited to, unauthorized absences from class or other program activities, the making of threats or engaging in harassment, violence or other misconduct. damage to, or defacement of, school, residence, or student property, the use, possession or distribution of alcohol or other substances, and/or other reckless or dangerous behavior. LdM reserves the right to take disciplinary action against a student based on the student's deviation from such rules, regulations and laws, or who otherwise engages in behavior that jeopardizes the safety and well-being of the student, members of the LdM community or any other person. Disciplinary action may include, but is not limited to, suspension or dismissal from the program. There shall be no refund of tuition, fees, or rent in the event that a student is suspended or dismissed from the program. LdM reserves the right to release to the student's primary institution or other interested party information regarding any failure of the student to comply with such rules, regulations or laws, as well as the details of any disciplinary action taken as a result thereof.

PROGRAM WAIVER

PRIVACY POLICY

LdM is fully committed to respecting the privacy of all applicants and all visitors to its website. The information that you provide to LdM will only be used for the purpose of carrying out your interest in the LdM program. Your personal information will not be shared with any third party, except for LdM's affiliates or partner institutions or as otherwise authorized by you.

Additionally, Year-Long Certificate Program students must pay:

- Half of program cost by July 15.
- \$500 tuition deposit plus \$1,200 advance rent payment for Spring (if securing student apartment through LdM) by November 1.
- Final balance by December 15.
- If students apply on or after the application deadline (June 15) but before the Fall program payment deadline (July 15), they must pay Housing Advance if securing student apartment through LdM, plus the \$500 tuition deposit.
- If students apply on or after the Fall program payment deadline (July 15), they must submit half the program cost upon application, including Fall housing payment in full, if securing student apartment through LdM.

CANCELLATION POLICY/CERTIFICATE PROGRAM (YEAR-LONG CERTIFICATES)

- \$500 initial program payment can be refunded net of bank fees if the cancellation occurs prior to the 60 days preceding the program start date.
- \$1500 Housing Advance (\$300 housing deposit and \$1200 advance rent payment) can be refunded net of bank fees if the cancellation occurs prior to the 45 days preceding the program start date.

IN ADDITION, IF AN OFFICIAL CANCELLATION NOTICE IS RECEIVED BY LDM:

- 44-11 days prior to the beginning of the term, the student will be liable for half of the fall semester program cost, including housing if through LdM.
- 10-0 days prior to the beginning of the fall semester, the student will be liable for the fall semester cost plus the \$500 spring deposit.
- 30-11 days prior to the beginning of the spring semester, the student will be liable for half of the spring balance.
- 10-0 days prior to the beginning of the spring semester, the student will be liable for the spring balance.

CANCELLATION POLICY/SEMESTER CERTIFICATES

- \$500 initial program payment can be refunded net of bank fees if the cancellation occurs prior to the 60 days preceding the program start date.
- \$1500 Housing Advance (\$300 housing deposit and \$1200 advance rent payment) can be refunded net of bank fees if the cancellation occurs prior to the 45 days preceding the program start date.

IN ADDITION, IF AN OFFICIAL CANCELLATION NOTICE IS RECEIVED BY LDM:

- 44-11 days prior to the beginning of the term, the student will be liable for half of the program costs. Furthermore, students who cancel 30-11 days prior to the beginning of the term will be liable for the advance rent payment.
- 10-0 days prior to the beginning of the term, the student will be liable for full program costs.
- After the start of the program, liability amounts to full program costs and no refund will be made.
