

Language of Instruction

LdM classes are conducted in English, except for Italian Language courses, which are taught in Italian. In addition, some courses from other subject areas are featured in Italian for students proficient in the language.

Course Offerings and Credit Transfer

LdM offers students over 400 different courses in 32 subject areas among the Institution's three locations. LdM courses are designed to complement a variety of academic majors as well as to enrich the student's experience, education and skills. Courses include, but are not limited to, the Arts and Humanities, Business, Social Sciences, Studio and Performing Arts, Design, and Italian Language and Culture.

Students may earn US credits for courses taken at LdM. Students enrolling directly through LdM have the option of receiving either the LdM transcript or a US transcript from Marist College (US accredited institution and LdM partner). Students enrolling through affiliate institutions or providers should contact their program or home institution to learn more about their transfer of credit.

Faculty

LdM's faculty is comprised of over 200 experienced and dedicated professors. LdM instructors share an international outlook that supports the LdM mission of delivering a high-quality international learning experience. Faculty selection is based on academic qualifications and commitment to community engagement and empowerment, among other LdM core values. Whether co-directing the Center for Ancient Mediterranean and Near Eastern Studies, organizing the exhibition of student sustainable design projects at the Salone del Mobile trade fair in Milan, or developing collaborative research and internship opportunities for their students, LdM faculty are engaged in scholarship and active in their professional fields outside the classroom.

Advanced Coursework in Art and Design





Student Life at LdM

LdM is an Italian institution with 40 years of experience in study abroad, providing students with an authentic intercultural learning experience. In addition to the rich and varied academic content at its three campuses, LdM guides students to a deeper level of understanding of the Italian lifestyle, language, culture, and customs.

Diversity at LdM

As The Italian International Institute, LdM embraces diversity and welcomes students from all over North America and from over 80 countries worldwide, including Korea, France, Brazil, Sweden, Chile, and Russia, among many others.

LdM encourages intercultural communication among its students from diverse backgrounds, whether geographic, social, or academic, fostering a community of mutual understanding and respect.

Housing Arrangements

LdM's experienced on-site housing coordinators facilitate student housing placement. Housing options include student apartments, family stay, and independently-arranged housing. Student apartments are the most popular and affordable option, providing the opportunity to live with other LdM students within the historical city center.

Getting Involved and Getting Around

LdM students find many ways to experience Italy's rich culture in and around Florence, Rome and Tuscania – including Italian movie nights, guided tours of important museums and landmarks, theatrical performances, exhibition openings, lectures on Italian culture and life, soccer games, and day trips to nearby towns. LdM premises are located in or near major transportation hubs, allowing students to explore beyond Italy as well.

Student Services, Clubs and Excursions

Dedicated staff and advisors are available to guide and assist students, providing support, local resources, and current information at the on-site orientation and throughout the program. At LdM Florence, a variety of student clubs offer social and cultural opportunities that connect students with the Italian community.

LdM also offers activities and weekend excursions led by full-time professors and staff to some of Italy's most famous and beautiful locales such as the Alps and Garda Lake, Capri, Sorrento and Pompeii, as well as others outside of Italy, such as the French Riviera and Switzerland.

















FLORENCE

The LdM Florence campus is one of the largest international schools in Italy, located in twelve campus buildings in the historic city center near the famous Duomo Cathedral and next to the bustling San Lorenzo market and church.

The LdM buildings are Wi-Fi equipped and contain a full range of facilities including large classrooms and specialized art studios, a cafeteria, courtyard garden, library, student point, and computer center. The vibrant surrounding neighborhoods are filled with shops and restaurants.

Courses: Subjects offered in Florence include art history, international business, architecture, fine arts, archaeology and classical studies, communications, public relations, dance, peace studies and globalization, sociology, psychology, wine and cuisine, classic and digital photography, fashion design and merchandising, restoration and conservation studies, graphic and interior design, jewelry art and design, and many more.

ROME

Rome - the Eternal City - in its unparalleled history, has developed its own flavor both as an ancient and modern world capital. The city's unique metropolitan environment is comprised of small, lively neighborhoods and picturesque districts with hills, piazzas, fountains, churches, and cobbled streets. LdM Rome is located near the city's center in an elegant Umbertine palace in the government and business district. The newly renovated building provides modern, Wi-Fi equipped facilities, including light-filled studios and classrooms. Flourishing Roman shops and restaurants surround the campus, and many famous sites, such as the Spanish Steps and the Trevi Fountain, are within walking distance.

Courses: LdM Rome students can choose courses in subjects such as history, classical civilizations, art and literature, as well as international business and marketing, political science, film studies, environmental studies, and Italian language.

TUSCANIA

The historic hilltop town of Tuscania is located in the Lazio region of central Italy, in the breathtaking countryside of the Maremma (south from Florence and not far from Rome). Tuscania promotes full academic and cultural immersion in this pastoral setting. The LdM Tuscania campus is situated in an elegantly modern structure in the old town center that is incorporated into the medieval stone walls. Reading rooms, classrooms, exhibition space, studios, a library, and a computer lab fill the renovated, Wi-Fi equipped interior. The facilities also include a small courtyard and a state-of-the-art culinary classroom for courses in Mediterranean cuisine. As a place that has inspired famous filmmakers, artists, painters, and photographers for centuries, Tuscania has developed a reputation as a center for new artistic forms of expression.

Courses: Tuscania presents the ideal location for the study of Italian language, through its full immersion philosophy. The curriculum is designed to embrace the town's historical, artistic and cultural heritage, including such courses as Etruscan, Roman and Medieval history, archaeology and classical studies, fine arts, culinary arts, studio and performing arts, creative writing, literature, and Italian language. Each summer, archaeology field school students in Tuscania participate in an ongoing excavation of an Etruscan necropolis, in collaboration with the University of Florence.

VENICE

As part of the Three Cities Program (Spring semester), LdM Venice offers the possibility to explore the history of this marvelous and unique city, how it became an economic superpower in the Middle Ages and how its breathtaking architecture was shaped by the Greeks and Muslims worlds. The Marist-LdM Venice Biennale Program (Summer intensive session) focuses on studio art and the still prominent role played by the city in the contemporary art world during the Biennale exhibition.

Programs & Degrees

The LdM academic calendar follows a semester structure (Fall and Spring) and includes a January Intersession and three, month-long Summer sessions. US credit is available for all LdM programs below.



ACADEMIC SEMESTER & YEAR ABROAD

The academic semester and year abroad programs foster awareness and understanding of not only the course topics, but also of Italian culture. Students may customize their courses of study from over 400 courses offered in 32 content areas.

ONE SEMESTER-THREE CITIES

Students may concentrate their entire semester at any one of the three LdM campuses or choose to experience local and regional differences within Italy through the "One Semester – Three Cities" Program, wherein students study Italian language and the roots of Western Culture in Tuscania, Rome, Florence or Venice.

SUMMER SESSIONS

The summer sessions consist of monthlong courses during June, July, and August. These programs are well-suited for undergraduate students seeking summer academic credits as well as independent students seeking a meaningful educational experience.

JANUARY INTERSESSION

The three-week January Intersession program provides the opportunity for undergraduate students as well as independent or adult students to study abroad.

MARIST-LdM DEGREE PROGRAMS

International students are able to earn a US undergraduate Bachelor's Degree through LdM partner, Marist College. These fully-accredited US degree programs offer the unique experience of extended undergraduate study at an international institution. The following four-year degrees are available: Art History, Italian Language, Digital Media, Fashion Design, Studio Art, Interior Design, and Conservation Studies.

In continued partnership, Marist College and Istituto Lorenzo de' Medici offer the Marist-LdM Graduate Degree Program at LdM Florence. This interdisciplinary advanced degree program, now offering the one-year M.A. in Museum Studies, offers students an in-depth exploration of how museums operate within their social and cultural contexts.

FLORENCE & SOUTHERN ITALY SUMMER RESTORATION WORKSHOPS

The hands-on Restoration Workshops, offered in both June and in July, consist of a month-long exploration of restoration, history, religion and culture, balancing studio and classroom instruction at the LdM campus in Florence with restoration field work in another inspiring Italian location.

SUMMER ARCHAEOLOGICAL FIELD SCHOOLS

The Center for Ancient Mediterranean and Near Eastern Studies (CAMNES) at LdM conducts field schools each summer in ancient Mediterranean archaeology. The intensive field schools are held at important Etruscan sites near beautiful Tuscania, Italy and other Mediterranean locations. Taught in collaboration with the University of Florence, the field schools combine on-site field work and specialized academic instruction by an expert team of archaeologists. Students can receive credits in Anthropology, Classical Studies, or History for successful completion of each field school

ONE-YEAR CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

The LdM Certificate Programs are designed to develop a student's creativity, artistic talent, and technical skills within structured plans of study. Combining a strong theoretical base with practical work for the pursuit of professional goals, LdM offers one-year Certificates and Professional/Advanced Certificates in the following disciplines: Fashion Design, Fashion Marketing & Merchandising, Graphic Design & Visual Communication, Jewelry Art & Design, Interior Design, Restoration & Conversation, and Fine Arts. These programs begin in the Fall semester each year and are available for US credit.

ONE-SEMESTER CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

Semester Certificates give students the opportunity to gather the professional skills and the theoretical underpinnings of exciting fields in design in a single semester. Subjects are: Fashion Communication, Interior Design in Contemporary Living, Product Design towards Sustainability, Architecture in Urban Context

In collaboration with CAMNES, the Center for Mediterranean and Near Eastern Studies, LdM also offers "Hands-on Archaeology" (Fall semester at LdM Florence) and "Ancient Italy" (Spring semester at LdM Tuscania). Each certificate covers ancient and medieval civilization, and both include an archaeology field school experience in Tuscania at a large and relatively recent dig whose Etruscan tombs have revealed a wide variety of objects over 2,300 years in age.

At LdM Florence, students may also choose to attend the semester-long certificate in International Conflict Transformation, in which case-based and hands-on courses go beyond conflict theory to train students in the practical skills needed to manage a wide range of conflicts in the real world. This semester-long program is offered in collaboration with the University of Florence Department of Peace Studies and The National Conflict Resolution Center (NCRC), based in San Diego, California.

INTERNSHIPS

LdM internships offer students the possibility to learn different aspects of working in the Italian workplace. Italy is known for its artisan and small business structure and LdM strives to place students in these types of companies, which offer not only greater interaction with the student, but also the opportunity to understand the strengths and structure of the Italian workplace in a variety of fields. Internships are available for US credit and are offered in combination with academic courses only.
