ADMISSION CRITERIA

Students must be at least 18 years old by the start of the program. LdM requires students to have upheld good academic and disciplinary standing. For the **Fashion Marketing & Merchandising Certificate**, students must have completed one year of university by the start of the program.

Application Deadlines - Acceptance of late applicants is subject to available space in the program.

Proof of English Proficiency - In order to learn effectively, students are expected to be independent English users with proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Non-native English speakers are required to demonstrate that they have reached the high intermediate level in English language skills, with certification or other evidence equivalent to the following minimum overall TOEFL scores: Paper Based Test 550+, Computer Based Test 213+ or Internet Based Test 80+.

Students must be in a good medical/psychological condition to succeed in the program.

Please contact the International Enrollment Office if you do not meet one of these criteria for additional information and instructions.

PROGRAM SPECIFICS – ACADEMIC YEAR CERTIFICATES

- **Students may enroll in the selected program only for the complete academic year (two semesters). The first semester of each program is offered in the Fall only and the second semester is offered in the Spring only.**
- All Certificate Programs are offered in Florence only. Please note that once you arrive at LdM you will not be allowed to switch Program or Location.
- Students with prior knowledge of the selected field of study may be admitted to the non-beginning semester of the 1st year Certificate, after submitting a portfolio of their work to be assessed and approved. The second semester of each Certificate takes place in the Spring semester only; prices are available on request. Spring Semester Deadline - November 15th.
- Students may choose to start with the Certificate and move into the Professional/Advanced Certificate, completing a two-year program.
- Students applying for the Professional/Advanced Certificate Program must provide proof of a solid background in the selected area. An admissions committee will review the application and accept only those students who meet the entry requirements. Please note that if you select the Professional/Advanced Certificate Program but do not meet the requirements, you will have the option of being admitted to the Certificate Program.
- The Certificate Program is comprised of a series of courses that have been determined by LdM as a complete learning experience in the field. All of these courses must be completed as part of the program. Students will be granted the Certificate or Professional/Advanced Certificate upon successful completion of the course sequence. Students who do not successfully complete the course sequence will receive a Certificate of Academic Performance only.
- Students who would like to enroll only in one semester at LdM (with the exception of the students who are applying to the non-beginning semester of the 1st year Certificate as above) should apply for the Study Abroad Programs or Semester Certificates.

REGISTRATION POLICIES

- The LdM Year-Certificate and Professional/Advanced Certificate courses have already been determined by LdM. Students cannot change their courses or sections.
- The Semester Certificate courses have already been determined by LdM and students cannot change the course selection. Core courses or sections cannot be changed. Only one track course can be changed upon arrival at LdM, choosing from the list of approved track courses and depending on course availability. Section changes are not allowed for track or core courses. Any track course change is only allowed during the first week of classes, before the Final Registration deadline. All course change requests must be supported by a strong academic reason.
- Students may attend only the courses listed on their Official Registration form. Auditing is not allowed.
- Many of the Studio Art and Design courses list two time blocks. Students enrolled in these courses must attend both time blocks.
- Students pre-registered for a non-beginning course, including Italian, must check the LdM Course Schedule online to make sure they meet all the prerequisites. A placement test will be administered to confirm the students' level. As a result of the placement test, LdM reserves the right to move students into a different level.
- A level test will be administered at the beginning of Intermediate/Advanced level Studio Art and Design courses to confirm the students' level. Students who fail one or more level tests will have the option of enrolling in the beginning level of the Certificate or switching to the Study Abroad Program and paying the difference in tuition.
- Students must retain full-time status. Students relying on financial aid are responsible to know if they are required to be enrolled in a minimum number of courses/hours
- No refunds will be issued for any reason after arrival at LdM.
- In the event of insufficient enrollment in particular courses (especially at the higher levels), LdM reserves the right to adjust the balance of teaching/open studio hours.
- Mid-terms and final exams will be given only on the scheduled days that appear on each course syllabus and will not be moved under any circumstances including illness, travel plans, family matters etc. Exams are scheduled during normal class times, so more than one exam may be administered on the same day. Students are not allowed to make up any assessed in-class activities they may have missed (including, but not limited to, quizzes, tests etc.) under any circumstances including illness, travel plans, family matters etc.
- Students with documented learning disabilities will be subject to local educational standards. Based on current and official documentation of the disability, LdM will provide assistance to these students. It is each student's responsibility to provide this documentation during the registration process and within the deadline. LdM is able to guarantee the following: Italian language tutoring, administration of exams in separate classrooms, and extra time for completion of exams.
- LdM does not offer Pass/Fail grades or Incompletes, only letter grades. All classes registered for and grades received will appear on each student's academic record. Students are responsible for understanding the LdM grading system. Detailed information about grading/evaluation can be found in the specific course syllabi.

- LdM reserves the right to withhold the certificate/academic record and/or housing deposit of students who violate contract agreements related to housing and/or academic issues (i.e., any balance or debt incurred) and/or whose behavior is considered detrimental towards the institute and other students.
 - The Rules of Conduct applied at this Institute may be different from the rules applied by the student's home college or university.
 - The Lorenzo de' Medici Rules of Conduct must be carefully read by each student. A copy of the Rules of Conduct is included in the Orientation Packet given to every student and is also distributed during Orientation at LdM and shown in every building of the Institute.
- It is ABSOLUTELY REQUIRED that all students attend the ORIENTATION MEETING. Students must make sure they plan their travel itinerary accordingly. The arrival date listed on the LdM academic calendar must be respected.
- All students are required to carry a cell phone at all times that can receive text messages and phone calls in Italy and to provide the phone number to LdM at Orientation.
- Applicants to the Semester Certificates may be asked to provide an alternative site and alternative courses (if applicable), depending on enrollment demand for the selected term.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

- The LdM Certificate classes are intensive and practical, so course attendance is a primary requirement for a responsible learning experience. Absences will also be counted during the first week of class.
- Punctuality is mandatory. Students must arrive in class on time: any lateness, leaving class during the lesson without notice, not showing up on time after the break or leaving early will impact the participation grade and the Final Grade.
- Students are responsible for keeping track of their absences and for catching up on any missed work.
- Make-up classes are always mandatory as part of the course program.
- If a class occasionally creates conflict with another class, the student is required to inform both instructors in advance.
- For no reason (i.e., travel plans, family matters etc.) will absences be excused.
- Students will receive an "F" on each exam they miss.
- Students who leave LdM before the end of the term must fill out an Official Withdrawal Request form and return it to their advisor. Students who submit the form by the "W" Withdrawal deadline will receive a "W" for each non-completed course. Students who submit the form by the "W/F" Withdrawal deadline will receive a "W/F" for each non-completed course. Students who leave LdM without submitting the form will receive an "F" in each non-completed course. In all cases, students will not receive a refund.
- Students who absent themselves from courses will have their final grade penalized as indicated on the following table:

STUDENT CONDUCT

Deviations from such rules, regulations and laws include, but are not limited to, unauthorized absences from class or other program activities, the making of threats or engaging in harassment, violence or other misconduct, damage to, or defacement of, school, residence or student property, the use, possession or distribution of alcohol or other substances and/or other reckless or dangerous behavior. LdM reserves the right to take disciplinary action against a student based on the student's deviation from such rules, regulations and laws, or who otherwise engages in behavior that jeopardizes the safety and well-being of the student, members of the LdM community or any other person. Disciplinary action may include, but is not limited to, suspension or dismissal from the program. There shall be no refund of tuition, fees or rent in the event that a student is suspended or dismissed from the program. LdM reserves the right to release to the student's primary institution or other interested party information regarding any failure of the student to comply with such rules, regulations or laws, as well as the details of any disciplinary action taken as a result thereof.

CANCELLATION POLICY

If an official cancellation notice is received by LdM:

- 20 days or more before the start of the term, the student will be liable for 20% of the tuition.
- 19 to 7 days before the start of the term, the student will be liable for 30% of the tuition.
- 6 days to the beginning of the term, no refund will be given.

After classes start, no refund will be due to students who do not attend or who withdraw from LdM. Fees are not transferable to other persons. Students will receive the refund minus the cost of any transfer fees.
