CREATIVE ARTS

The School fosters the development of the professional skills and intellectual growth necessary for undertaking creative and intellectual inquiries and translating them into a work of art. This evolution is achieved through the study of the artistic traditions of the masters while embracing a culture of innovation and change. By building an expressive language, students acquire a refined set of tools for personal awareness, expression, and creativity.

The curriculum relies on a flexible structure aiming to elicit students' drive to create, encouraging their natural expression, as well as their critical self-awareness.

DESIGN

NUTRITION, ITALIAN GASTRONOMY AND CULTURE

Launched in the fall 2019, the School of Nutrition, Italian Gastronomy, and Culture is offering courses inspired by Italy's generous culinary traditions.

The School's interdisciplinary curriculum conducts a parallel rigorous scientific discourse on the principles of nutrition and on the way in which the socio-cultural, historical and anthropological characteristics of the different regions of Italy are reflected in their culinary heritage.

Committed to teaching students to understand food as a primary form of cultural and artistic expression, LdM instructors combine creativity with scientific rigor in the nutrition research and practice.

SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS

Thanks to our dedicated faculty, students are introduced to the eye-opening world of scientific knowledge and methods, in an approach that combines focused instruction with hands-on lab work.

The University of Florence's "Science Center" also collaborates with LdM's Restoration Department to instill in students an understanding of the chemical principles and analytical methods that constitute the foundations of art conservation.

AGRICULTURE

The School of Agriculture in Tuscania aims to unite traditional and innovative methods of sustainable and environmentally responsible agriculture through a holistic approach.

Students gain the tools and knowledge to link the environmental, social and cultural management of natural resources to preserve biodiversity. The School's curriculum relies not only on practical applications, but also on the study of social and cultural implications, encompassing a variety of themes that range from the food supply to forestry management.

Academics

Dedicated international professors, small class sizes and inspiring academic fieldtrips. For those pursuing an academic experience abroad, passionate interest or wanting to specialize in a professional career, LdM programs offer students every the best opportunity to advance in their educational goals.





Due to LdM's favorable positioning, fully equipped facilities and innovative methods, students can enjoy hands-on, interdisciplinary learning with experts while experiencing Italy as a classroom without walls.

LdM's style of academic learning gives each individual the opportunity for personal expression and the practical application of new skills, through interdisciplinary projects and engagement with the professional sector. LdM students have integral roles in conferences, creative arts and design exhibitions, theatre performances and film productions, archaeological digs, restoration projects, and many other activities that complement the academic experience.

COURSE OFFERINGS AND CREDIT TRANSFER

There are around 600 courses in 35 departments aimed to enhance the students' academic paths and to enrich their learning experience, personal growth, and real-world skills. Students may earn US credits for courses taken at LdM. Students enrolling directly through LdM have the option of receiving either the LdM transcript or a US transcript from Marist College (US accredited institution and LdM partner). Students enrolling through affiliate institutions or providers should contact their program or home institution to learn more about their transfer of credit.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

LdM classes are conducted in English, except for Italian Language and Culture, which are taught in Italian.

Programs and degrees



*ACADEMIC SEMESTER AND YEAR ABROAD**

The academic semester and year abroad programs foster awareness and understanding of not only the course topics, but also of Italian culture. Students may customize their program of study according to their academic needs and personal interests. Believing in the value of Italian language classes as an essential part of the study abroad experience, LdM requires students to take at least one Italian language course during their first semester.

As part of its Academic Programs, Istituto Lorenzo de' Medici offers students the possibility to learn different aspects of working in Italy, a country known for its artisan and small business structure, by taking a credit-bearing curricular internship. Internships are offered in various fields of study, from Art History to Communications, and Design. Placement opportunities are limited and vary on each campus. Students taking an internship through LdM must fulfill the relevant prerequisites, and follow the application procedures.

SPECIAL SEMESTER-LONG PROGRAMS

Two Italies Program

Students may concentrate their entire semester at any one of LdM campuses in Florence or in Tuscania, or choose to experience local and regional differences within Italy through the Two Italies Program. This study abroad experience connects students to the two LdM sites, offering them a diverse and informed approach to the multifaceted aspects of contemporary Italy.

JANUARY INTERSESSION

The three-week January Intersession provides the opportunity for undergraduate students as well as independent or adult students to study abroad in Florence.

SUMMER SESSIONS

The summer sessions consist of month-long courses during June and July. These programs are well-suited for undergraduate students seeking summer academic credits as well as independent students seeking a meaningful educational experience. Additional summer programs include the Florence & Southern Italy

Restoration Workshops, the Archaeological Field Schools, and the Yoga Wellness Workshop: Body and Spirit at LdM Tuscania.

SPECIAL SUMMER PROGRAMS

Restoration Workshop

Taking place between Florence and Southern Italy, this workshop provides an exciting opportunity for students of various backgrounds to acquire the basis of Restoration, while deepening their personal cultural experience and creative skills.

Archaeological Field School

Istituto Lorenzo de' Medici and CAMNES run a four-week intensive Archaeology Field School in Tuscania, in the Lazio region. There, students take part in the excavation of authentic Etruscan artifacts, gaining an understanding of this ancient culture and learning archaeological methods.

Yoga Wellness Workshop: Body and Spirit Workshop

This summer workshop offers an immersive experience in the Yoga tradition in the beautiful setting of Tuscania. During a one-month program, students will have the

opportunity to explore the spiritual, mental, and physical practice of Yoga: as a path to attain spiritual realization and union with the divine, as a way to quiet the busy modern mind (mindfulness), and as a healing and balancing physical daily practice.

ONE-SEMESTER CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

Semester Certificates give students the opportunity to gather the professional skills and the theoretical underpinnings of exciting fields in design and other subjects in a single semester. Semester Certificates include: Visual Communication for Fashion, Interior Design in Contemporary Living, Product Design towards Sustainability, Architecture in Urban Context, Italian Gastronomy, and Balance in Nutrition.

ONE-YEAR AND PROFESSIONAL/ ADVANCED CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

The LdM year-long Certificate Programs are designed to develop a student's creativity, artistic talent, and technical skills within structured plans of study. Combining a strong theoretical base with practical work for the pursuit of professional goals, LdM offers one- and two-year Certificates in the following disciplines: Fashion Design,

Fashion Marketing & Merchandising, Graphic Design & Visual Communication, Jewelry Design, Interior Design, Restoration & Conservation, and Fine Arts. These programs begin in the fall semester each year and are available for US credit.

MARIST-LdM DEGREE PROGRAMS

International students are able to earn a US undergraduate Bachelor's Degree through LdM's partnership with Marist College. These fully-accredited US degree programs offer the unique experience of extended undergraduate study at an international institution. The following four-year degrees are available: Art History, Italian Language, Digital Media, Fashion Design, Studio Art, Interior Design, Conservation Studies, and Global Marketing Communication.

MARTIST-LdM VENICE BIENNALE PROGRAM

The Venice Biennale summer program takes place during the Biennale exhibition, and focuses on studio art and the prominent role played by the city in the contemporary art world.

The LdM academic calendar follows a semester structure (Fall and Spring) and includes a January Intersession and two, month-long Summer sessions. US credit is available for all LdM programs.

MARIST-LdM VENICE BIENNALE



Florence

The LdM Florence campus is one of the largest international schools in Italy. Situated in the historic San Lorenzo district, next to the bustling historical market and the ancient church, LdM encompasses 14 campus buildings throughout the city center.

THE LdM BUILDINGS are Wi-Fi equipped and contain a full range of facilities including numerous classrooms, specialized art studios, modern culinary labs, a cafeteria, courtyard garden, library, student point, and computer center. The vibrant surrounding neighborhoods are filled with shops and restaurants, including the central market which hosts the cooking school Cucina LdM.

At LdM's main campus in Florence, students can choose from a wide range of courses, including advanced coursework in art, design, and restoration. Study abroad programs range from Academic Year and Semester to Summer Sessions and January Intersession. Florence is also home to the LdM Certificate Programs and the Marist-LdM Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programs.

COURSES

Subjects offered in Florence include art history, communications, international business, nutrition and Italian gastronomy, fashion design and merchandising, fine arts, architecture, ancient studies, visual and performing arts, restoration and conservation, interior design, graphic and jewelry design, sociology, psychology, photography, sciences and many more.

CULINARY ARTS IN FLORENCE

LdM main building in via Faenza sits next to one of the most lively spots in Florence, the historical Mercato Centrale, one of the oldest covered markets in town, where Florentines have been doing their grocery shopping since its opening in 1874. On the newly restored first floor of the Mercato, LdM has created the Cucina LdM, a modern kitchen with sixteen professional workstations equipped with innovative





appliances and utensils. Here, students are able to learn about Italian and Florentine cuisine in the midst of an inspiring and unique ambience.

LdM-FONDAZIONE FRANCO ZEFFIRELLI COLLABORATION

In 2018, LdM began a rewarding collaboration with Fondazione Franco Zeffirelli - International Center for Performing Arts, which is located right in the heart of the historic city center of Florence. The Center, supported during his life by the Maestro himself and nowadays by his family, aims to make the artistic and cultural heritage of Zeffirelli's 70-year career available to both the city of Florence, his birthplace, and internationally, to future generations.

Zeffirelli is known world-wide for cinematic masterpieces like his Academy Award nominees *Romeo and Juliet* (1968) and *The Taming of the Shrew* (1967) with Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton. The long list of acclaimed actors he directed in his lifetime also includes Dame Maggie Smith, Dame Judi Dench, Mel Gibson, Glenn Close, Jon Voight, Faye Dunaway, Fanny Ardant, Jeremy Irons, and Cher. Working as a director of theater and opera productions, Zeffirelli collaborated with institutions such as La Scala in Milan and the Met Opera in New York.

The LdM-Fondazione Franco Zeffirelli collaboration inspires a variety of interdisciplinary courses that draw from the performing and visual arts, literature, art history, media arts and studies and more. Students can approach jewels of world literature by Shakespeare and Dante from a Zeffirelli-like, versatile perspective, analyzing the ways in which they were interpreted and adapted across mediums and time. Zeffirelli's multifaceted legacy offers a model for anyone wishing to undertake a career in the arts and for those seeking to embrace their own talents of expression from every possible angle regardless of major.

FLORENCE AND SOUTHERN ITALY SUMMER RESTORATION WORKSHOP

The workshop, offered twice a year, in June and July, provides an exciting opportunity for participants of various ages and backgrounds to deepen their personal cultural experience and creative skills. The four-week long workshop consists of a month-long hands-on exploration of restoration and conservation. The program balances studio and classroom instruction at the LdM campus in Florence with a one-week restoration field work in Rocca Imperiale, a medieval hill town located in the region of Calabria. The region, in southern Italy, is of extraordinary historical, cultural and archaeological value due to its past as a flourishing ancient Greek settlement, its fertile ground and strategic location.

LdM GALLERY

Experimentation and dialogue within interdisciplinary forms of art is the main goal of the LdM Gallery, a young project by Istituto Lorenzo de' Medici, and a space where academic research and artistic practice meet within a professional setting. Encouraging the development of creativity and sophistication within the student body, and generating an open dialogue between students and the public, the LdM Gallery fosters opportunities for students to experience the reality of the art world beyond an institutional setting and gain professional experience through their artwork.





TUSCANIA

The historic hilltop town of Tuscania is located in the Lazio region, central Italy, in the breathtaking countryside of the Maremma. Owing to the smaller size of the town and its geographic location, students in Tuscania live and study in a typical Italian environment, closely interacting with the local community.



Culture and tradition in a land of golden fields and olive trees

LdM TUSCANIA site is situated in the historic town center surrounded by medieval stone walls. Its facilities include reading rooms and a library, an artist laboratory, a computer center, exhibition space, and a fully equipped instructional kitchen overlooking a community garden.

COURSES AND ACTIVITIES

LdM Tuscania supports an immersive approach through a selection of courses in liberal and creative arts, as well as in the scientific field, with its School of Agriculture. History and archaeology classes focus on the Etruscan, Roman and medieval civilizations that are at the core of Tuscania's history and development, while courses in agricultural sciences and culinary arts highlight Tuscania's connection to the natural cycles and traditions of the region.

Organized activities introduce students to ancient, local handicrafts and traditions to include organic farming, bread baking, gelato making, clay sculpting, fresco painting, textile restoration, and glass work. Students have the opportunity to volunteer at pre- and primary schools, at the Tourist Information Office, or at the local library.

At LdM Tuscania students are also offered a wide variety of outdoor well-being initiatives and sport activities, from yoga to horse riding, which help them build a strong relationship with the surrounding natural and cultural environment.





Site visits and field trips help students to broaden their cultural horizons, enhancing the understanding of ancient cultures, customs, and different contemporary lifestyles. Students often participate in trips to Rome, and to the ancient towns of Viterbo, Orvieto, and Civita di Bagnoregio.

SUSTAINABLE AND ENVIRONMENTALLY RESPONSIBLE AGRICULTURE

Tuscania is a unique location to study agriculture: it sits among fertile hills which are as rich in agricultural produce as they are in Etruscan heritage. The mild climate is influenced by the proximity of the Mediterranean Sea, and the agricultural activity takes place nearly year-round. Locals are engaged with nature on a daily basis, which allows them to find innovative ways of interpreting and utilizing traditional agricultural activities to obtain high-quality food products while respecting the environment.

The School of Agriculture at LdM Tuscania allows students to learn from highly qualified and experienced faculty and through engagement with the local community. The academic offering also embraces the aspects of economic principles and their application to the agricultural sector and to the management of natural resources such as forests. Practice is an important part of all the courses.

CAMNES-LdM YOGA WELLNESS WORKSHOP: BODY AND SPIRIT

During a one-month program, students will have the opportunity to explore the spiritual, mental, and physical practice of Yoga: as a path to attain spiritual realization and union with the divine, as a way to quiet the busy modern mind (mindfulness), and as a healing and balancing physical daily practice. Students will learn various breathing (Pranayama) and meditation techniques along with yoga's sister discipline, Ayurveda, a five-thousand-year-old Indian

healing system, while gaining a practical, first-hand understanding of varied types of Yoga. Once a week lesson students will take part in off-campus practical activities in some of the most enchanting locations of the area.

SUMMER ARCHAEOLOGICAL FIELD SCHOOL

The Center for Ancient Mediterranean and Near Eastern Studies (CAMNES) at LdM conducts field schools each summer in ancient Mediterranean archaeology. The intensive field schools are held at important Etruscan sites near beautiful Tuscania. This program gives students the possibility to dig and uncover 2500 year old artifacts and structures of the Etruscan civilization, while interacting with Italian participants, and enjoying the breathtaking countryside.

The field schools combine on-site field work and specialized academic instruction by an expert team of archaeologists. Students may receive credits in anthropology, ancient studies, or history for successful completion of the field schools.

TWO ITALIES PROGRAM

WITH THE TWO ITALIES PROGRAM, students embark on an intercultural journey exploring different aspects of the Italian culture and lifestyle.

The program starts in cosmopolitan Florence, a city of art, design, and fashion. It then continues to Tuscania, a picturesque hill-top town in northern Lazio, located right between Florence and Rome, the Italian Capital, in one of the country's most authentic and unspoiled areas, also noted for its Etruscan necropolises.

The curriculum is a celebration of all things Italian, from the country's ancient history, to its excellence in the area of eno-gastronomy, approached from a Business and Marketing viewpoint. At the same time, Two Italies engages students with a reflection upon contemporary and eternal issues, such as the pursuit of happiness in challenging times, and the importance of sustainable practices in today's food production and supply.

An exploration of the Italian Language ties together the students' experience through two of the most fascinating regions of our country. In Florence (Tuscany region), they get the Italian Language basics necessary to start navigating Italian everyday life. In Tuscania (Lazio region), students immerse themselves in the welcoming environment of the countryside for an authentic Italianstyle experience, getting the chance to engage in daily conversation with locals and to discover the natural beauty of the surroundings.

This dynamic program offers students a diverse and informed approach to the multifaceted aspects of contemporary Italy. It allows them to learn more about cultural differences and the settings in which they find themselves. Students remain at each location for six weeks and take a total of five 3-credit classes. Students will be closely supported by LdM's expert and experienced team of advisors, support staff, and faculty at each of these locations.





Student life

IN ADDITION TO the rich and varied academic content at its three campuses, LdM guides students to a deeper level of understanding of the Italian lifestyle, language, culture, and customs through student clubs, volunteer opportunities, excursions, and recreational activities.

DIVERSITY AT LdM

As the Italian International Institute, LdM embraces diversity and welcomes students from all over North America and from over 100 countries worldwide, including Mexico, the Netherlands, China, Spain, Sweden, Belgium, Colombia, India and Russia, among many others. LdM encourages intercultural communication among its students from diverse backgrounds, whether geographic, social, or academic, fostering a community of mutual understanding and respect.

*STUDENT SERVICES, CLUBS AND EXCURSIONS**

Dedicated staff and advisors are available to guide and assist students, providing support, local resources, and current information at the on-site orientation and throughout the program. LdM students find many ways to experience Italy's rich culture in and around Florence and Tuscania – including Italian movie nights, guided tours of important museums and landmarks, theatrical performances, exhibition openings, lectures on Italian culture and life, soccer games, and day trips to nearby towns. At LdM Florence, a variety of student clubs offer social and cultural opportunities that connect students with the Italian community. LdM also offers activities and weekend excursions led by full-time professors and staff to some of Italy's most famous and beautiful locales such as the Alps and Garda Lake, Venice, Capri, Sorrento and Pompeii, as well as others outside of Italy, such as the Principality of Monaco and Switzerland.

PROFESSIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

The LdM Professional Opportunities Program in Florence provides students with a non-credit experiential learning opportunity based upon the completion of one single project. Students are able to collaborate with both the LdM institute and local businesses, organizations and associations. Upon successful completion of the project, students receive a certificate of participation.

*VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES**

LdM has developed relationships with various charities and organizations in order to provide contacts for students interested in volunteer work. While engaging in volunteering activities, students have the chance to improve their Italian language skills and meet new people.
