# **Course Selection**

• YOU MUST OBTAIN THE APPROVAL FOR YOUR COURSES BEFORE SUBMITTING YOUR COURSE SELECTION. You are responsible for ensuring that your home institution will grant you credits for courses (both first choices and alternatives) taken at LdM. This includes any changed courses as a result of placement test/level adjustments.

• It is your responsibility to verify that there are no time conflicts among your selected courses and alternatives.

- Make sure that you sign up for the amount of credits required by your home institution, without exceeding the maximum number of credits allowed.
- LdM encourages students to consider course load and exam scheduling when making registration decisions.
- Students registering for any non-beginning course must choose the appropriate level by carefully checking the LdM Academic Catalog and Course Schedule (online) for prerequisites. Italian language is optional during short terms and during the second semester for academic year students.
- At LdM, non-beginning students will take an Italian placement test to confirm their level. As a result of the placement test LdM reserves the right to move students into a different level. Therefore students must be aware that their schedule is subject to adjustments.

### **GENERAL POLICIES**

**Admissions** Students must be at least 18 years old by the start of the program. LdM requires students to have upheld good academic and disciplinary standing. Applicants must have completed one year of college/university credit and have a minimum 2.80 cumulative GPA. In order to learn effectively, students are expected to be independent English users with proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Students must be in a good medical/psychological condition to succeed in the program.

**Proof of English Proficiency** In order to learn effectively, students are expected to be independent English users with proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Non-native English speakers are required to demonstrate that they have reached the high intermediate level in English language skills, with certification or other evidence equivalent to the following minimum overall TOEFL scores: Paper Based Test 550+, Computer Based Test 213+, or Internet Based Test 80+. ### **Registration Policies**

### **Attendance Policies**

- Students will automatically be enrolled in their alternative program/course/ section if any first choice is unavailable (whether canceled due to insufficient enrollment or full). The Registrar reserves the right to move students to a different section to balance enrollment, or deny course change requests.
- 2) All course change requests, before and after arrival, must be supported and accompanied by a strong academic reason.
- A level test will be administered at the beginning of Performing Arts and Intermediate/Advanced level Studio Art and Design courses to confirm the students' level. Many of the Studio Art and Design courses list two time blocks.
   Students enrolled in these courses must attend both time blocks.
- Students may attend only the courses listed on their Official Registration form. Auditing is not allowed.
- Only one class can be changed upon arrival at LdM, depending on course availability. This is only allowed during the first days of classes, before Final Registration. Final Registration deadlines will be announced during Orientation. No exceptions will be made to these deadlines. This is not available for the Two Italies Program, semester certificates, field schools or workshops.
- 6) Students participating in an internship must fulfill the relevant prerequisites. Concurrent enrollment in a course in the same field is required. The application for an LdM internship is due by the application deadline, along with the required supporting documentation (eg. student's resumé, formal letter of intent, two reference letters, portfolio, etc.). Late submission of the supporting documentation can compromise the eligibility for an internship placement. Placement in internships is not guaranteed and choosing an alternate course is mandatory. Students taking an internship must retain a minimum of 15 credits per semester. Internships cannot be added during the add/drop period. Internships have particular attendance regulations.
- 7) No refunds will be issued for classes dropped after arrival at LdM.
- 8) Students are not allowed to change Program or Location after arrival
- 9) Students must retain full-time status, with a minimum of 12 credits per short term. However, it is each student's responsibility to know if his/her home institution requires enrollment for more than 12 or 3 credits respectively. Furthermore, students relying on financial aid are strongly encouraged to maintain a standard 15 credit minimum during the semester and a 6 credit minimum during short terms. Students may not drop or withdraw (with a "W" or "W/F") from a course if it would bring them below the minimum number of credits. Non-credit offerings are available only in addition to credit-bearing courses.
- 10) Mid-terms and final exams will be given only on the scheduled days that appear on each course syllabus and will not be moved under any circumstances, including illness, travel plans, family matters, etc. Exams are scheduled during normal class times, so more than one exam may be administered on the same day.
- 11) Students are not allowed to make up any assessed in-class activities they may have missed (including, but not limited to, quizzes, tests, etc.) under any circumstances, including illness, travel plans, family matters, etc.
- 12) LdM does not offer Pass/Fail grades or Incompletes, only letter grades. All classes registered for and grades received will appear on each student's LdM transcript regardless of their intent to transfer credits to their home institution. Students are responsible for understanding the LdM grading system and their home institution's minimum grade requirement for the transfer of credit. Detailed information about grading/evaluation can be found in the specific course syllabi.
- 13) Students with documented learning disabilities will be subject to local educational standards, and therefore may not be provided with the same accommodations offered by their home institution. However, based on current and official documentation of the disability, LdM will provide assistance to these students. It is each student's responsibility to provide this documentation within the deadline. LdM is able to guarantee the following: Italian language tutoring, administration of exams in separate classrooms, and extra time for completion of exams. For certain types of learning disabilities, the student may qualify for an exemption from the Italian language class.
- 14) LdM reserves the right to withhold the transcript and/or housing deposit of students who violate contract agreements related to housing and/or academic issues (i.e. any balance or debt incurred) and/or whose behavior is considered detrimental towards the institute and other students.

- (both online and onsite). Students must make sure they plan their travel itinerary accordingly. For the Two Italies Program, all orientations are mandatory (both online and in person at each site). The arrival date listed on the LdM academic calendar must be respected, unless the student's program has arranged an earlier arrival.
- 16) All students must carry a cell phone at all times that receives text messages and phone calls in Italy, and provide the phone number to LdM at Orientation.
- 17) Applicants to the Two Italies or Tuscania program may be asked to provide an alternative site and alternative courses (if applicable), depending on enrollment demand for the selected term.

NOTE: DUE TO COVID-19, THE LDM ATTENDANCE POLICY WILL NOT BE REINFORCED IN CASE OF ILLNESS. STUDENTS WHO ARE ABSENT DUE TO FLU/COVID-19 RELATED SYMPTOMS/ILLNESS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROMPTLY CONTACTING THEIR LDM ADVISOR FOR FURTHER INSTRUCTIONS

- Course attendance is a primary requirement for a responsible learning experience at LdM. Students are expected to participate in and attend, all online and in person class meetings. However, in case of Flu/ Covid -19 related symptoms/ illness, students must not attend class in person and instead should promptly contact their LdM Advisor. For any other attendance related concerns, students should contact their LdM Advisor as soon as possible.
- Punctuality is mandatory. Students must arrive in class on time: any lateness, leaving class during the lesson without notice, not showing up on time after the break, or leaving earlier, will impact the participa-tion grade and the Final Grade.
- 3. Students are responsible for keeping track of their absences and for catching up on any missed work.
- 4. Make-up classes, also during reading days where necessary, are always mandatory as part of the course program.
- 5. If a class occasionally creates conflict with another class, the student is required to inform both instructors in advance.
- 6. For no reason (i.e. travel plans or family matters, etc.) will absences be excused.
- Absences will also be counted during the first days of class unless students added the class during the add/drop period.
   Students will receive an "F" on each exam they miss.
- 9. Students who leave LdM before the end of the term must fill out an Official Withdrawal Request form and return it to their advisor. Students who submit the form by the "W" Withdrawal deadline will receive a "W" for each non-completed course. Students who submit the form by the "W/F" Withdrawal deadline will receive a "W/F" for each non-completed course. Students who leave LdM without submitting the form will receive an "F" in each non-completed course, students will not be eligible for credits or receive a refund.
- 10. Students should take into consideration that LdM courses may run MONDAY through FRIDAY during the semester and that their schedule may be subject to adjustments until the final registration deadline.

The undersigned therefore agrees to assume and take on all responsibilities in any activities associated with the LdM program. In consideration of, and in return for, the service, facilities and other assistance provided to participants by LdM (and their governing boards, employees, and agents) I, the undersigned, along with any of my assignees, heirs, distributees, guardians, and legal representatives, to the extent permitted by law, release LdM and its affiliates and partner institutions from any and all liability, claims and actions that may arise from injury, harm or death to the undersigned and from loss or damage to the undersigned's property or person in connection with these activities. The undersigned understands that this release covers liability, claims and actions as a result of injury to property or persons caused entirely or in part by any acts or failure to act by LdM, including but not limited to negligence, mistake, or failure to super-vise by LdM or any affiliates or partner institutions or any of their employees, agents, or contractors.

### STUDENT CONDUCT

### ADVISOR CERTIFICATION

Students may not change the transcript type once classes have begun. Furthermore, Marist College cannot issue a transcript retroactively for a student who originally requested the LdM transcript for his/her studies.
