ADMISSION CRITERIA

Students must be at least 18 years old by the start of the program. LdM requires students to have upheld good academic and disciplinary standing. Students must be in a good medical/psychological condition to succeed in the program.

Application Deadlines - Acceptance of late applicants is subject to available space in the program.

Proof of English Proficiency - In order to learn effectively, students are expected to be independent English users with proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Non-native English speakers are required to demonstrate that they have reached the high intermediate level in English language skills, with certification or other evidence equivalent to the following minimum overall TOEFL scores: Paper Based Test 550+, Computer Based Test 213+ or Internet Based Test 80+.

REGISTRATION POLICIES

- The Academic Year Certificate courses have already been determined by LdM. The LdM Registrar will enroll you in the appropriate pre-determined section/s according to your certificate choice. Students cannot change their courses or sections.
- The Semester Certificate courses have already been determined by LdM. Core courses or sections cannot be changed. Only one track course can be changed upon arrival at LdM, choosing from the list of approved track courses and depending on course availability. Section changes are not allowed for track courses. Any track course change is only allowed during the first week of classes, before the Final Registration deadline. All course change requests must be supported by a strong academic reason. LdM encourages students to consider course load and exam scheduling when making registration decisions.
- The Summer Certificate courses have already been determined by LdM. The LdM Registrar will enroll you in the appropriate pre-determined section/s according to your certificate choice. Students cannot change their courses or sections.
- Students may attend only the courses listed on their Official Registration form. Auditing is not allowed.
- Many of the Studio Art and Design courses list two time blocks. Students enrolled in these courses must attend both time blocks.
- Students pre-registered for a non-beginning Italian language course must check the LdM Catalogue and Course Schedule online to make sure they meet all the prerequisites. A placement test will be administered to confirm the students' level. As a result of the placement test, LdM reserves the right to move students into a different level.
- A level test will be administered at the beginning of Intermediate/Advanced level Studio Art and Design courses to confirm the students' level. Students who fail one or more level tests will have the option of enrolling in the beginning level of the Certificate or switching to the Study Abroad Program and paying the difference in tuition.
- Students must retain full-time status. Students relying on financial aid are responsible to know if they are required to be enrolled in a minimum number of courses/hours
- No refunds will be issued for any reason after the program start date.
- In the event of insufficient enrollment in particular courses (especially at the higher levels), LdM reserves the right to adjust the balance of teaching/ open studio hours.
- Mid-terms and final exams will be given only on the scheduled days that appear on each course syllabus and will not be moved under any circumstances, including illness, travel plans, family matters, etc. Exams are scheduled during normal class times, so more than one exam may be administered on the same day.
- Students are not allowed to make up any assessed in-class activities they may have missed (including, but not limited to, quizzes, tests etc.) under any circumstances, including illness, travel plans, family matters, etc.
- Students with documented learning disabilities will be subject to local educational standards. Based on current and official documentation of the disability, LdM will provide assistance to these students. It is each student's responsibility to provide this documentation during the registration process and within the deadline. LdM is able to guarantee the following: Italian language tutoring, administration of exams in separate classrooms, and extra time for completion of exams.
- LdM does not offer Pass/Fail grades or Incompletes, only letter grades. All classes registered for and grades received will appear on each student's Certificate of Academic Performance. Students are responsible for understanding the LdM grading system. Detailed information about grading/evaluation can be found in the specific course syllabi.
- LdM reserves the right to withhold the Certificate/ Certificate of Academic Performance and/or housing deposit of students who violate contract agreements related to housing and/or academic issues (i.e., any balance or debt incurred) and/or whose behavior is considered detrimental towards the Institute and other students.
 - a) The Rules of Conduct applied at this Institute may be different from the rules applied by the student's home school.
 - b) The Lorenzo de' Medici Rules of Conduct must be carefully read by each student. A copy of the Rules of Conduct is included in the Orientation Packet given to every student and is also distributed during Orientation at LdM and shown in every building of the Institute.
- It is ABSOLUTELY REQUIRED that all students attend all ORIENTATION MEETINGS (regardless of whether these take place online or onsite). Students must make sure they plan their travel itinerary accordingly. The arrival date listed on the LdM academic calendar must be respected.
- All students are required to carry a cell phone at all times that can receive text messages and phone calls in Italy and to provide the phone number to LdM at Orientation.
- Applicants to the Semester Certificates and Summer Certificates may be asked to provide an alternative site and alternative courses (if applicable), depending on enrollment demand for the selected term.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

- The LdM Certificate classes are intensive and practical, so course attendance is a primary requirement for a responsible learning experience. Students are expected to participate in and attend, all online and in person class meetings.
- Punctuality is mandatory. Students must arrive in class on time: any lateness, leaving class during the lesson without notice, not showing up on time after the break or leaving earlier, will impact the participation grade and the Final Grade.
- Students are responsible for keeping track of their absences and for catching up on any missed work.
- Make-up classes, also during reading days where necessary, are always mandatory as part of the course program.
- If a class occasionally creates conflict with another class, the student is required to inform both instructors in advance.
- Absences will also be counted during the first days of class unless students added the class during the add/drop period.
- Students will receive an "F" on each exam they miss.
- Students who leave LdM before the end of the term must fill out an Official Withdrawal Request form and return it to their advisor. Students who submit the form by the "W" Withdrawal deadline will receive a "W" for each non-completed course. Students who submit the form by the "W/F" Withdrawal deadline will receive a "W/F" for each non-completed course. Students who leave LdM without submitting the form will receive an "F" in each non-completed course. In all cases, students will not receive a refund.
- Students should take into consideration that LdM courses may run MONDAY through FRIDAY during the semester and that their schedule may be subject to adjustments until the final registration deadline.
- Students who absent themselves from courses will have their final grade penalized as indicated on the following table:
